A Nonprofit Music Festival Returns to Bethlehem, PA this August

BETHLEHEM, Pa., - The tradition of Musikfest returns to the city of Bethlehem this August. The nonprofit music festival will be held from Aug. 4-14, 2022.

Musikfest is a 10-day music festival that features music, food, art and street performers. There are hands-on activities for families and children to participate in for the full art experience.

Musikfest is a free and non-gated music festival for the entire community to attend. The only tickets that need to be purchased are for the headliners. Headliners for this year will include Kelsea Ballerini, Willie Nelson & Family, Poison and Alabama.

Sunday, Aug. 7, is Inclusion Day at Musikfest. There will be American Sign Language (ASL) interpretation at Coast to Coast, The Funkitorium, Baha Men and Poets for Justice. All of these performances will take place at the Air Products Americaplatz.

"The Musikfest Inclusion Zones are sensory-supportive spaces that provide services, tools and amenities to benefit individuals with sensory-processing difficulties of all ages and disabilities," said ArtsQuest, the organization behind Musikfest.

As Musikfest returns to Payrow Plaza, there is a newly named PNC Stadtplatz. The new Platz name was suggested through social media by over 2,000 fans of Musikfest. The meaning behind it is that it stands for "city place" or "town square." The Platz will feature free performances every night from 5-10 p.m.

The festival runs throughout the entire city of Bethlehem. The north side covers the Historic Moravian District and the south side covers SteelStacks in the SouthSide Arts District. The north

side hours are Aug. 5 from 5-11 p.m. and Aug.6-14 from noon - 11 p.m. The south side on weekdays will run from 4-11 p.m., on Fridays from 4 p.m. - 1 a.m., Saturdays from noon - 1 a.m. and Sundays from noon - 11 p.m.

As mentioned before there will be food options available to all attendees including new ones coming this year. The new food spots include The Little Sicilian, The Munchy Machine, Big Wil & The Warden, Homer's Girl, French Toast Bites and Slabs and Crabs.

Attendees can't forget to grab Musikfest's signature mug that is reinvented each year. Mugs can be used for hot and cold drinks and can be filled up at stations throughout the festival. There will be other artwork that matches the mug that can be purchased at Musikfest merchandise.

The art activities that are available will include glassblowing, paper poppy making, the Crayola Creativity tent and much more. Attendees can also browse through local art pieces and craft vendors. The street performers are loved by crowds young and old as well.

Tickets can be purchased through the website at https://www.musikfest.org/tickets/vip-packages/. There are VIP packages that include the steel terrace and the oasis. These packages cost \$20 and creature reserved seating, private restrooms, a full-service bar and a parking pass.

Backgrounder

Musikfest originated in 1984 in the Lehigh Valley region, but more specifically Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Musikfest is a non-gated free music festival founded by Jeffrey Parks, the principal leader of the music festival. Jeffrey Parks was president of ArtsQuest, the company that runs the event, for 31 years.

ArtsQuest is a 501 nonprofit organization that provides access to culture, art and educational programs to the residents along with friends of Lehigh Valley. Artsquest programming reaches out to more than 1.9 million people each year through events such as its flagship event, the Banana Factory Arts Center and Musikfest. Roughly 50% of Artsquest events are free, however, they have a combined economic impact of \$136 million each year.

Musikfest is the largest free music festival in the United States. It happens annually in August for 10 days and features more than 500 performances. The original Musikfest in 1984 brought in about 184,000 people. Musikfest 2021 welcomed in over a million returners and newcomers for food, music, drinks and a fun time.

The music festival features 15 different stages between the south side and the north side. The festival is not just music; it includes over 49 food vendors waiting for customers to try their delicious meals. Not only that, but those who attend the 10-day event will also come to find street performers, family activities, hand-crafted items being sold and a firework display.

As mentioned the music festival is entirely free, however, to see the headliners of the festival fans must have a ticket. Headliners in the past years have included Darius Rucker, Sam Hunt, Jimmie Allen, Weezer, The Chainsmokers, Brad Paisley and many more. Musikfest also takes into consideration the fact that there are many music genres out there. The festival includes a genre for everyone whether that's pop, R&B, rock, country or jazz.

The headliners this year will include Kelsea Ballerini, Willie Nelson & Family, ALABAMA and Poison. Musikfest will be held from Aug. 4, 2022 - Aug. 14, 2022.

Musikfest is a 10-day event that every fan should know how to prepare for

Are you ready to start your week and a half at Musikfest? Here are some helpful tips to make sure you are prepared for what's to come. You will find out about where you can eat, stay and park to make sure you and your friends and family have the absolute BEST time!

Where to Park

Don't be worried about getting to and from the site. Musikfest has you covered with all of your transportation necessities. There are two remote areas to park that will have a shuttle service that will bring the attendees to the festival grounds. To arrive at the Colonial Industrial Quarter on the north side of the festival fans should park in the valley center parkway. To arrive at the SouthSide Arts District of the festival fans should park at 240 Emery St. As mentioned, there will be a round-trip service shuttle that costs \$5 per adult and \$3 per child. In order for fans to travel to and from the different festival grounds, attendees can use the north-south transfer which will cost \$4 per adult and \$2 per child for unlimited daily rides.

What to Eat

What's a music festival without a festival of food? Musikfest offers a plethora of food vendors, trucks and tents filled with every foodie's guilty pleasure. Some of the food vendors will include Sherry's Crab Cakes which features the famous MEGA crab sandwich, Greek Street which allows a vegan-friendly option of gyro and garlic chicken on a stick from Thai Jasmine. However, that's not all. Attendees can dive into Cubano Xpress, Island Expressions, Monte Cristo and The Munchy Machine. Don't forget to check out the Fud Truck for their secret menu option which is a hot chicken sandwich topped with a brown and roast beef sandwich.

Where to Stay

Just because you're not from Pennsylvania doesn't mean you should miss out on this week and a half filled with fun. There are multiple close places to stay including hotels and a bed and breakfast. One of its premier partners is the Wind Creek Bethlehem which is just a minute's walk from Musikfest. They also have a historic partner called, Historic Hotel Bethlehem, which is the number two historic hotel in the country. There is also a Holiday Inn, Comfort Suites, Hyatt and Sayre Mansion Inn nearby.
